COUNTY ATHLETICS CHAMPIONSHIPS - Mrs Mohan, PE

On Wednesday 6 June, 55 students from Bourne Grammar School took part in the Lincolnshire Schools' County Championships in Boston. Students were selected to represent South Lincolnshire after trials held in May and we were, by far, the most represented school at the competition.

Eight of the events for the Junior Girls were won by our students, including double wins for Fran Fenwick (Year 9) in the 100m and High Jump, and for Katie Callcut (Year 9) in the 75m Hurdles and Long Jump. A total of 15 County Titles were won - our best ever performance. The winners, along with the runners-up of each event, will represent Lincolnshire at the Anglian Schools' Championships in Norwich on Saturday 16 June and over 20 of our athletes will compete there.

The pinnacle of school athletics is the English Schools' Track and Field Championships, taking place this year in Birmingham on Friday 13 and Saturday 14 July. To compete, athletes have to achieve a tough entry standard. I am pleased to report that Fran Fenwick, Katie Callcut, Will Kong (Year 9) and Jasmine Allen (Year 12) have exceeded their relevant entry criteria and will be competing this year. All our athletes have the chance to qualify next week and at the the Anglian Championships.

It is a busy time for our athletes, with the Schools' Cup Regional Finals also on the horizon. Our Inter Girls, Junior Boys and Inter Boys are competing in the 'A' Final in Derby on Tuesday 12 June; the winners of this competition go through to the National Final in Gateshead in July. Students will be competing against the top-scoring schools in the region, which includes the counties of West Yorkshire, South Yorkshire, Nottinghamshire, Derbyshire, Leicestershire and Lincolnshire. All three teams have an excellent chance of reaching the Grand Final. Our Junior Girls are competing in the Regional 'B' Final at Grantham on Wednesday 13 June. Good luck to all our teams.

YEAR 9 STUDENTS VISIT THE HOLOCAUST CENTRE - *Report by Jess Gowers (Year 9)*

On Wednesday 6 June, the History Department took 120 Year 9 students to the Beth Shalom Holocaust Centre. On arrival, we were introduced to the theme of genocide and began to learn about the causes of the Holocaust and the horrific events that took place. We were given the question *Did people's choices cause the Holocaust?* to think about throughout the day.



Next we explored the museum, where we learnt about antisemitism throughout history and the social isolation of the Jewish community and other groups who, in Hitler's view, did not fit the 'Nazi utopia' of the Aryan race, leading to their tragic mass murder.

Afterwards we went into the memorial gardens. These were very beautiful and full of white roses to commemorate those individuals who died in the Holocaust. There were also many striking sculptures, such as one of Anne Frank and another that represented the children lost to the Holocaust. We all placed a stone in memory of these 1.5 million children who died which was an extremely moving experience.

One thing I will never forget is listening to Steven Frank, a survivor of the Holocaust; what he went through was unimaginably horrific. The trip was concluded with a discussion about more recent genocides, such as the Rwandan Genocide in 1994, and how we can help to stand up against discrimination and try to prevent anything as horrific as the Holocaust happening again. It is appalling to think that such atrocities are still occurring today.

The trip was both educational and informative, but also a highly emotional and heart-rending experience.
