## Message from Headteacher

Today marked our first Awards Assembly of 2026, and it felt entirely appropriate to begin with Year 7, recognising students at the very start of their journey through Bourne Grammar School. Across every subject, awards were presented for Best Overall Performance, Most Improved and Endeavour, alongside a special Oracy Award, reflecting the breadth of learning we seek to encourage. We also took time to recognise pastoral awards linked to positive conduct and contribution, celebrating qualities such as honesty and kindness. The standard recognised through these awards is high, and each badge represents sustained effort, commitment and achievement since the start of the academic year. What mattered most, though, was not simply the badges themselves, but the reminder that achievement is built over time through ambition, curiosity and determination. I was also keen to emphasise that students who were not recognised on this occasion are no less valued; effort and contribution are recognised and celebrated in many ways across the year, not solely through one awards assembly. Next week, I look forward to joining Heads of Year and Form Tutors to celebrate the achievements of our other year groups.



Over the past couple of weeks, members of the Leadership Team have been spending time visiting form rooms across the School, observing tutor sessions and talking with students. It has been a positive experience and a reminder of the important role tutor time plays in shaping school life. We saw many real strengths, including strong relationships between tutors and students and thoughtful discussions led by tutors around personal development themes such as healthy relationships, values and current issues.





One particularly striking example, shared with me following a tutor visit by a member of the Leadership Team, involved a Year 10 student, Zoe Roberts, confidently delivering a short presentation to her form on Birds of Prey in the United Kingdom. She spoke with real calm, assurance and clarity, engaging her peers and answering questions with confidence. Knowing how much Zoe has developed over time, it was a powerful reminder of the impact that regular opportunities to speak, present and be supported within form time can have on students' confidence and oracy. This moment highlighted not only Zoe's growth, but also the excellent work of her Form Tutor, Miss Smallshaw, whose encouragement, commitment and belief in her students were clearly evident, reflecting the excellent work carried out by tutors across the school each day.

We also held our Oxbridge Information Evening this week for students in Years 11 and 12, and it was particularly pleasing to welcome a significant number of students from other schools who are considering joining our Sixth Form. The evening was supported by our School Liaison Officer from Lincoln College, Oxford, who provided a clear and informative overview of what studying at Oxford or Cambridge involves, and what admissions tutors are typically looking for in successful candidates. The evening was designed to help students and their families make well-informed decisions, with further guidance and support available in school for those who choose to pursue this pathway.

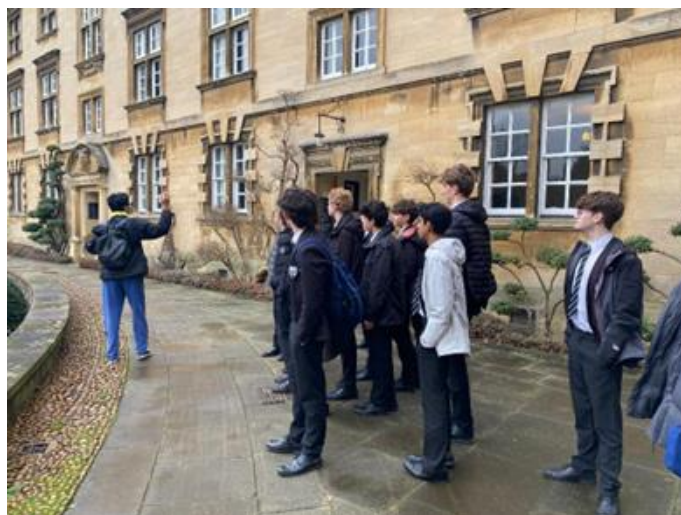

After refreshments, we listened to a talk about general university life. During this session, we learned about popular courses and discovered the wide range of societies students can join, such as the Assassin's Guild. We were given many opportunities to ask questions, which we took full advantage of.

One popular theme was asking about specific courses and the A-levels needed to take them. We were told broadly what most universities accept, as well as Cambridge's unique requirements.

Later, the differences between most universities and Oxbridge universities were explained. This helped us understand why they are considered some of the best universities in the world. Before lunch, we took part in a Q&A session with three current students, including Jess, a BGS alumna.

Lunch was then provided, including pizza and vegan kofte. After lunch, we went on a tour of Christ's College, where we saw the dining hall, the Master's Garden, and several other areas of the campus, like an outdoor swimming pool.

Finally, we returned to the theatre for a talk about finance and the support available to students, such as student loans and bursaries. At the end of the trip, we were given stickers of Christ's College's two cats, Finch and Baines.

## County Badminton Tournament – 5 February 2026 – Miss C Bowtell

Four teams set out to Lincoln to compete in the U16 and U14 Boys and Girls County Badminton Tournament. The winners of this event will then compete in Nottingham in a regional tournament against the best school in the Midlands. The tournament requires players to compete in doubles and singles events of various combinations and so consistency in quality is essential.

There were six teams in the U14 boys tournament, five in the U16 boys and five teams in the U14 Girls event and U16. The U16 boys' team was a very strong team consisting of Saihaan Damani, Aakash Ranjith, Charles Bomford, Monty Bage and Akshith Pandian and we went into the event with full confidence. The boys started very well with a tight game against William Farr but managed to overcome them and then won easily against Holbeach school. This left Kings Grantham and LSST, two schools renowned for their racket sports. The boys fought hard against both and narrowly lost 3-2 to both schools but performed excellently throughout the morning. The U14 team were new to this event and slowly grew into the required level of play, often learning from making earlier unforced errors in shots and communicating better in their doubles matches. The team eventually came third but will have learnt a significant amount about how to improve their play by facing these tough opponents. The team was Kirithik Mohan, Harshil Kadire, our silent assassin, Srikar Puppalla and Viganth Rg.

The U16 girls had a last-minute recruit in super sub Rishita Dutta to complete their veteran team of Mary, Queen of the Rackets Pepper, Honor Moore and Kiki Timmins. This wonderful group of girls have represented the school throughout their time at Bourne and have shown resilience, determination, fantastic team spirit and sportsmanship in all matches. They placed third but lost many matches by very small margins and know the improvements they have all made across the years.

The U14 girls team were hot favourites after warming up and seeing the opposition at the event but it's all about conversion. They destroyed Holbeach only giving away 8 points out of 55 in their match and Vale Academy who had two quite accomplished players. The team led by Aarikha was focussed on the job throughout and when facing LSST and some dubious line calls remained calm and found a way to win matches. This led to the important game against our arch-rival's KGGS. Proud Vichathum started the match with a superb match against their number 1 player but narrowly lost despite some spectators making comments about how on earth could two young girls hit the shuttle so hard and be so accurate. The fantastic doubles pairing of Maddy Hobson and Abi Lakin evened things up leaving Aarikha in her singles match to show KGGS how to win a match. Sadly we lost the Proud and Maddy doubles leaving the outcome of the game on a knife edge. The score was 2-2 in games, and it all went down to Aarikha and Abi vs KGGS final doubles pairings. The two girls held their nerve throughout superbly even when mine was in tatters and went on to win easily leading us to County glory.

What was lovely to see at the end was the sportsmanship and friendships formed in the informal games played between schools after the event was over.



## Anglian Cross Country Championships – Saturday 31 January 2026

Abington Park, Northampton, was the venue for the Anglian cross-country championships last Saturday and with 21 students in attendance for the event, we had students in all eight different age groups and were arguably the school with the largest contingent of any Lincolnshire school.

The competition sees the best 16 athletes from Suffolk, Norfolk, Northamptonshire, Cambridgeshire and Lincolnshire all competing to secure places for their county at the English Schools Cross-country Championships at Sefton Park, Liverpool in mid-March. With conditions ideal for cross-country and running spikes taped on to secure them through the muddy conditions, it was Yvette Annis (Senior girls) who led the races out at 12 noon. An exceptional run for Yvette saw her finish in ninth place and simply reaffirm her selection for Liverpool. Maddie Keith in the Year 7 (Minor) Girl's competition was our sole representative who ran exceptionally well to finish in 36th position and gain her first county representation for the School.

In the Minor boys, Bourne had the largest contingent of five athletes with all performing well in the middle of the field. Oliver Barker was highest placed for the school in 56th, followed closely by Alfie Fleming (68th), George Calvert (70th), Usaym Moin (71st) and Emmett Saker (73rd). The best performance from any Bourne athlete at the event was from Sam Griffin in the Junior Boys (Years 8 & 9). An exceptional run from Sam, who is currently in Year 8, saw him finish in an outstanding 7th position and also secure his position for the English Schools. Ciaran Mackay also ran well finishing in 58th position overall.

Three strong runs from our Junior Girls saw excellent performances from Amberly Keith (25th) closely followed by Sofia Christoudias in 34th position and Madeleine Hobson in 38th. In the Inter Girls competition, a super performance from Leah Graham (14th) will also see her in Liverpool next month and Edith Kaberry (40th) will need to wait to see if she qualifies in one of the two remaining places still available for Lincolnshire in that age group.

In a very strong Inter Boys race (Years 10 & 11) our two Year 10's again performed very strongly. Eli Saralis finished in 56th position closely followed by Cayden Mackay in 63rd. Again, two good performances running against students a year older than themselves. In the final race of the day, and the longest, the 6.1k course encompassed three loops of the very challenging and hilly course. Unfortunately, Theo Saralis was unable to start due to injury but Toby Staines finished in an excellent 50th position, with Miles Garrido in 57th and Noah Henderson in 61st. Overall, an outstanding day with exceptional performances from every student involved.

We will shortly hear of those who have qualified for Liverpool as places for the Final are discussed early next week.

For our younger years, the Fenland League will resume soon after February half term but running club with Mr. Lattimer continues on Mondays and Wednesdays after school for all those wishing to improve their running or general fitness. All are welcome.



## **Year 8 Hockey Super Zone Tournament**

The girls played four matches, securing a respectable third place from six teams.
