



SIXTH FORM DRESS CODE 2026-27

All students MUST wear

- A formal jacket or blazer

Tops - choose from:

- Shirt and tie
- Blouse
- Smart top
- Plain jumper

Backs and shoulders must remain covered

Bottoms - choose from:

- Formal trousers (e.g. suit trousers, tailored styles)
- Formal skirt (no shorter than the top of the knee when standing)

Dress

- Formal dress (no shorter than the top of the knee when standing)

Shoes - choose from:

- Formal shoes/boots (e.g. brogues, loafers, flats, small heels)
- Sandals (must have ankle straps)

You MAY also choose to wear, in addition to your blazer/jacket and top

- A plain jumper or cardigan
- A quarter length zip top
- Coat (only outdoors, not during contact time)

Accessories & Appearance

- Hair: Natural colours only
- Jewellery: Ear piercings and a single nose stud allowed
- Tattoos: Must be covered
- Lanyard: Must be worn at all times

What students CANNOT wear

Tops

- Polo shirts
- Sweatshirts or hoodies
- Strappy tops
- Cropped tops or tops which show the midriff
- Off-the-shoulder or low-cut tops
- Tops with logos or branding

Bottoms

- Jeans or denim
- Leather trousers/skirts
- Linen trousers
- Shorts, joggers, cargo trousers, leggings or any other casual trousers

Footwear

- Trainers or canvas shoes (Nike, Adidas, Converse, Vans, etc.)
- Flip-flops or casual sandals
- Uggs or casual boots

Accessories & Appearance

- Over-the-knee socks, fishnet tights, legwarmers
- Visible eyebrow, septum, or tunnel/taper piercings
- Unnatural hair colours or extreme hairstyles

General

- No figure-hugging material
- Underwear should not be visible through clothing

Non-Compliance

Students must inform their tutor, either during tutor time or via email of any legitimate changes to their dress that may result in a breach of the dress code (e.g. due to a sports-related injury).

First Breach:

Tutor or member of staff to email Pastoral Manager

A warning will be issued to the student by the Tutor.

The incident will be logged centrally by the Sixth Form Team.

Second Breach:

The Head of Year will contact home via letter.

The incident will be logged centrally by the Sixth Form Team.

Repeated or Serious Breaches:

Students will be referred to the Head of Sixth Form for a decision and formal sanctions, in line with the school's behaviour policy.

Possible sanctions include:

- Being required to change into alternative clothing provided by the school
- Removal of Sixth Form privileges
- Placement in SFC3, SFC2, or Isolation
- Being sent home to change
