The best preparation any potential A-Level Politics student could do is to develop a good grasp of current affairs both in the United Kingdom and United States. There are also a great variety of podcasts worth listening to. Try to engage with what is happening and keep a weekly journal that sums-up what happened in both countries in the previous week. This way you will have a bank of case study material to draw upon once the course begins. Case study material is incredibly important in A-Level Politics: your points will need to be backed up with recent examples.
