Aim:

The aim of the A-Level German course is for students to develop the ability to communicate effectively and become aware of cultural variations in countries where the German language is spoken. Students will also be encouraged to develop an understanding and knowledge of the language in a variety of contexts. In addition, their linguistic knowledge, understanding and skills will help students to take their place in a multilingual global society and provide a suitable basis for further study, so that informed decisions about career choices can be made later on.



Outline/Structure of Course:

The course focuses on how German-speaking society has been shaped, socially and culturally, and how it continues to change.

The course covers four distinct themes:

- Social issues and trends
- Political and artistic culture
- Grammar
- Literary text (Der Besuch der alten Dame) and film (Goodbye Lenin)

There are nine one-hour lessons per fortnight. During the course, students learn vocabulary and grammar needed to understand authentic material. Students will be expected to provide information and opinions about the themes relating to their own experiences and those of other people. All four skills (Reading, Listening, Speaking and Writing) are assessed at the end of Year 13.

Assessment

Paper 1: Listening, reading and writing

Exam: 2 hours 30minutes

50% of A-Level

Paper 2: Writing

One text and one film or two texts from the list set in the specification

Exam: 2 hours

20% of A-Level

Paper 3: Speaking

Individual research project and stimulus card

Exam: 17 minutes including 5 minutes preparation time

30% of A-Level
