October 2021 is Black History Month, and this week the Media Studies department have included an item with a Black History focus on the student notices document each day. Our students have been encouraged to engage with age-appropriate films such as “Green Book” and “Queen & Slim”, films that narrate the impact of segregation in the USA on a Black population struggling to find equality in a society divided on racial lines. It is entirely appropriate here to remember the famous words of the great Martin Luther King spoken in 1963:

*“I have a dream that my four little children will one day live in a nation where they will not be judged by the color of their skin but by the content of their character.”*

Very conscious of the importance of these words, I was inspired by the content of a Year 10 assembly delivered by Mr Baker on Wednesday when the wonderful diversity of humanity was celebrated and richness of human culture admired. Students in this assembly were challenged regarding their own behaviour, were challenged as to their reactions towards any prejudiced behaviour they might witness, and encouraged to reflect on how they, as individuals, can help contribute to a tolerant society. Cultural and racial tolerance must be a non-negotiable element in the make-up of British society, and it has been very pleasing to see such clear guidance and messaging being given to our students at this time. Martin Luther King was assassinated by a racist gunman in 1968, and the words of his daughter certainly resonate:

*“When he [Dr King] talked about the beloved community, he talked about everyone bringing their gifts, their talents, their cultural experiences. We live in a society where we may have differences, of course, but we learn to celebrate these differences.”*

Our students have themselves been proactive. We have an active LGBTQ+ club offering a safe space for the discussion of a range of issues and the Equality and Diversity Committee have made two provisional recommendations this week to help ensure that diversity is celebrated and understood within School. Firstly they wish to develop a School suggested reading list for students of books that collectively will provide a balanced social and cultural awareness and mitigate against any sense of division or prejudice. And secondly they would like a “Universal Student Union” established as a weekly platform for equality and a means to celebrate the richness of our own School community. Both sound like fantastic student-led ideas. While much of the world celebrates Black History month Bourne Grammar is therefore actively engaged in promoting equality and diversity.
