#### LINCOLNSHIRE COUNTY CHESS CHAMPIONSHIP

Former BGS Head Boy Scott Merriman (Year 13 Last Year) and Nicholas Lees (Year 11) took part in the annual Lincolnshire County Chess Championship on 16-17 July.

Scott and Nicholas finished first equal on 4 wins from 5 games together with a third member of Stamford Chess Club, each receiving an equal share of the overall prize money. Entering the final round, Nicholas was on 4 wins from 4 and Scott on 3 from 4. Their top table clash was hard fought, lasting nearly 3 hours with the game going down to the final seconds with Scott winning. Nicholas took the trophy based on an overall better win progression than his fellow Stamford team mates.



#### **SPORT**

One of our students had a busy summer competing, Lawson Capes (Year 9) started with a win at the England Athletics National Championships at Bedford. He didn't stop there, the following day he entered the Valhalla Invitational at York where he threw the shot put against the American World Champion Chase Ealy and Olympian Sophie McKenna and set a new PB of 15.35m. What a great experience!

Lawson followed this by throwing the discus against Lawrence Okoye the European bronze medallist from Munich, competing at Throwfest alongside his brother who was throwing for England. Lawson won the shot put with a throw of 15.29 and set a new PB in the discus with 41.31m again, against Lawrence Okoye and Nick Percy (Scotland).

Hot off the press! Lawson extended his PB in the shot just last weekend, throwing 15.60m at the Inter Counties Cup in Derby. He backed this up with a win in the discus, just 3cm shy of the 40m mark. As a result, he won the Field Performance of the Day. With just a couple of Open meetings left this season, he will look to extend both distances prior to the close of the outdoor season.
