Our uniform representatives met again to discuss the current state of the uniform consultation as it moves forward. Significantly, Ms Creedon also launched her new School Council structure with the help of Head Students and Prefects and it is great to see Year Group Councils gathering and forwarding their minutes to the Leadership Team for consideration.

I am also pleased to announce that, following a very successful trial last year, Bourne Grammar is investing in a full e-library package to be available from next week. Students will be able to sign out e-books to be read on tablets or kindle-style devices and while a mobile phone perhaps lacks the screen size for easy reading, the e-library also works on smaller devices such as phones. This will significantly enhance our literacy drive and provide cost free access to a wide range of titles. The evidence that wider reading enhances educational outcomes is incontrovertible and so we will be actively promoting this new platform across all year groups.

Finally, as we mourned the loss of Queen Elizabeth II during her state funeral on Monday, I thought it worth putting into print a section of her 2008 Christmas message that I referred to in a number of year group assemblies over the last fortnight. Her Majesty said this:

“When life seems hard, the courageous do not lie down and accept defeat; instead, they are all the more determined to struggle for a better future.”

This beautifully succinct statement encapsulates much of what education is all about and at a time when national and international challenges are so acute they are words worth absorbing. We must never stop trying to improve our contexts, enhance the positive nature of our impacts and strive for effective and collaborative solutions to the problems we face. I hope our students can apply the spirit of Her Majesty’s message to their own personal and educational lives as we move through this academic year
