


# **BOURNE GRAMMAR SCHOOL BULLETIN**

# YEAR 9 GCSE OPTION CHOICES - Mr Ransom, Deputy Head

Before students can select and submit option preferences, access to the options system must be activated. The unique access code that is required to activate the options system was sent to the <u>School email account</u> of each Year 9 student on Wednesday 22 February. Please note that this is a one-time-use-only code; once used it will not be needed again and cannot be used again.

Once activated, the options system can be accessed by going directly to <a href="www.sims-options.co.uk">www.sims-options.co.uk</a> and logging in with the email account and password set up at the time of activation.

Once option preferences have been successfully submitted no further action is required. Your preferences, and any subsequent changes you make, will only be submitted when you 'Save' your option selections. Please note: Due to a system enhancement, you can now use the School email account to sign in to log your options.

The parental consent box does not need to be ticked.
