In Year 7 the Careers Family Tree project asked pupils to investigate their family history and the jobs that family members had done in the past. As well as finding out more about their family members and ancestors, pupils could see the way that jobs have changed over the years.

It was amazing to see the creative ways that pupils undertook this project and the fantastic way that they presented their findings. Congratulations to Ellie Moore, Rory Connell, Chanelle Kye-Nyarko, Francesca Jones, Otto Forkin, Annabelle Bull, Tamsin Bates, Rebecca Board and Elodie Collins who were judged as winners and deserving of special recognition for their work.

MEET THE SOLICITORS EVENT FOR LAW STUDENTS AT BGS – Report by Mr Mitchell, Law

BGS A-level Law students had a fantastic opportunity to meet with local legal professionals at the end of last term in a 'Meet the Solicitors' event jointly organised by Law Subject Leader, Mr Mitchell; Careers Officer, Mrs Elliot; and Academic Administrator, Ms Hill.

The students were able to ask questions to a panel of four local solicitors:

1. Sharon Macaulay, a partner at Taylor Rose, specialising in civil litigation;
2. Ashley Sutherland of Hegarty Solicitors, specialising in corporate and commercial law;
3. Amy Knowles, a trainee at Buckles Solicitors, with experience in family law and dispute resolution; and
4. Matt Kefford, a non-practising solicitor who nevertheless shared his 'City law' experiences from the days when he was a civil litigator in Hong Kong.



The panel faced some questions about their day-to-day work and career routes (including the new Solicitors Qualifying Examinations) from Mr Mitchell and then rotated around the room to chat informally with the students. There was a real buzz in the classroom and the students clearly gained a great deal from the experience. The feedback from students afterwards was very positive indeed and so much so, that we would like to make this a BGS Law annual tradition.

Thank you very much to our guests for their time and expertise. The students certainly appreciated this valuable chance to meet with practitioners and reflect on career options in the legal profession.
