PLEASE HELP US TO STAY FULLY OPEN

As I write, the School continues to be fully open to all students. The situation nationally remains precarious so please do all you can to ensure that your sons and daughters remain safe, follow the Government's rules and do not relax them through complacency or any other reason.

NEW HEAD STUDENTS SPEAK

During the period of closure it was good to be able to keep in contact with students and with the staff body by online broadcasts. Now that we are back in School our new Head Students Tom Cameron and Evie Kendrew have picked up this baton and have broadcast to students in lieu of speaking with them face-to-face at start-of-year assemblies. Their first broadcast received a warm welcome from the Year 7 students. Our newest students were warmly welcomed by Tom and Evie who then went on to explain their roles and how they hope to serve the School community throughout their term of office. Further such broadcasts are planned. The Head Student Team is working up a virtual replacement for the Student Council; the Council cannot meet in its present form due to the bubble system so online meetings will commence shortly. I wish the Head Students well in this new activity. I have explained to them that this year, of all years, the support and inspiration they can offer the student body will be needed, and it will certainly be appreciated.

ARRIVAL AND DEPARTURE AT SCHOOL

I must remind all parents/carers that the various entrances to the School site which have been established under the bubble system open at 08:15. It is not possible to admit students before that time. It is understood that families' morning routines can be fraught for all sorts of reasons, but as far as is possible please do try to avoid bringing students to School before 08:15. This will become more important as the weather changes as winter approaches. Please be aware that there is no shelter from the weather if students arrive before the site opens at 08:15. This may not be a problem for much of the time at the moment whilst the weather is pleasant but it will soon become so.

COVID-19 - PLANNING FOR REMOTE LEARNING

We continue to operate under the threat of Covid-19. Whilst I hope that the threat is minimal and that the School can continue to run as well as it is at present, it is possible that there might have to be changes in how we operate at very short notice and circumstances might arise in which we may be required to send home one or more year-groups for a week or more. Should we have to switch to remote learning due to a full or partial closure, we will again use the Microsoft *Teams* platform and our teachers are currently in the process of receiving further training on the use of *Teams*. They are already reasonably familiar with it, having used the system for much of the closure period. In a little over a week's time we will start to deliver *Teams* training to all students in dedicated sessions. These will be supplemented with guides produced in-house and video tutorials which can serve as an *aide-memoire*, if needed. As is the case with exercises such as fire evacuation drills, it is hoped that we will never need to use the *Teams* system in a closure situation but by investing time now, we can help students to feel well prepared so that learning without undue hindrance should circumstances turn against us.

ROAD SAFETY

From time to time I receive messages of concern from motorists regarding students who cross the road outside the School other than by means of the pedestrian crossing. The A15 is a busy road so it really is essential that those students who must cross it use the marked crossing. Please could parents/carers do all they can to ensure that their sons and daughters understand this?
