It has also been a week of internal examinations for Year 12 as they prepare for university applications in the months ahead. The Science Block smells of burning chemicals once again, while musicians and artists have begun to rediscover their creative energy in these reopened departments. The access to specialist facilities has certainly been an unqualified success and everyone's spirits have been lifted.

And while we wrestle with ongoing moderation of TAGs for Year 11 and Year 13 students I have therefore found myself staying thank you a lot. I am grateful to staff for all the skill and effort they have put into TAGs, I am grateful to everyone that worked hard to make the bubble changes happen and grateful to all our students for returning this week with such optimism and purpose. We have volunteers running clubs and expeditions for students, staff putting together wellbeing activities for their colleagues, an education research group in full flow and workshops for students using enrichment topics as material for future interviews. We have a summer school for incoming Year 7 students being prepared, and a new raft of celebration assemblies being organised. And there is so much more in the wings. Reflecting on demonstrations of gratitude, teenagers have a habit of taking much for granted and not taking the time to reflect on the good that is around them. I must emphasise that I do not believe the young people of today are any worse than my generation or other generations have been in this regard: the art of reflection in the light of experience is something that can only grow with age and is rare in all school-aged children. However, this does not mean we should abandon all hope of nurturing gratitude as a fundamental ingredient of our School community. I have emphasised my commitment to kindness before; and as an extension I would like to see all members of our School community looking outward as much as possible and demonstrating kindness by being grateful. Simple demonstrations of appreciation are extremely powerful and a 'thank you' accompanied by a smile can help lift another's spirits instantly. The pace of modern living, the strains of work and revision for our students, and our tendency to look inward at the things we want for ourselves can become so all-consuming that we forget to be grateful or lose sight of the good things we have. The Shawnee Chief Tecumseh at the turn of the 19th Century is reputed to have said: 'If you see no reason to give thanks, the fault lies in yourself.' Quite right. At a time of national optimism and the imminent (we hope) return to normality let us all be thankful for what lies ahead and not dwell on the difficulties of the recent past. A glass half full is so much more appealing that a glass half empty, and taking time to say thank you helps keep that cup well filled.


