I would also like to congratulate those who completed their qualifying Silver Duke of Edinburgh expedition last weekend. Weary but cheerful students got off the coach on Monday at almost exactly the same time as other students were walking onto the stage to perform their musical items from Stage and Screen. There was something rather apt in the short period of car park chaos that ensued, testimony to the amount of positive participation at all levels in our very good school. Many thanks to Mrs Brett and her team for the success of the expedition, and the profile and high levels of participation that are maintained throughout the scheme.

This week has also seen the completion of an excellent phase of work experience for our Year 12 students. Around 200 were found high quality placements (including one who managed an international placement in Greece!) and a further 45 were provided with an in-house programme of talks and experiences directed specifically at futures beyond school.
