Throughout the workshop, we had the opportunity to develop our understanding of the characters and symbols utilised in La Casa de Bernada Alba. The workshop provided us with unique experiences such as performing scenes from the play with direct support from the actress, and games. Helping us to express the emotions conveyed in the scenes that we couldn't interpret just by reading the play allowed us to express our empathy and understanding of each character's individual situation. 
We will also be hosting our annual Oxbridge Information evening on **Wednesday 28 February** for students in years 11 and 12 and their parents. More information will follow later in the month.

These totals show all House Points earned minus Behaviour Points. It includes points from all students in each house between 4/9/2023 - 04/01/2024.


