



U13 BOYS REGIONAL TENNIS FINAL - Report by Miss Bowtell, PE Department

Following the recent success in the County Final against Healey School in Grimsby, the U13 Tennis team travelled to Loughborough University to compete in the next stage of the competition. Here, the boys would face the very best teams of the Midlands schools involved in the Division 2 Championships.

The boys were a little nervous at the start of the match, as they didn't know how good the competition, Idsall School, would be. When Will Stanier (Year 9) blasted his way to a 6-0 victory, closely followed by a victory for Ed Hall (Year 9), the team started to relax. Fraser Lesiw (Year 8) faced opposition a lot taller than him, but he was unfazed by the size difference and strode to a clear victory. This left Connor Young (Year 8) to face a bit of pressure from the team as expectations were high - he overcame this to make it a full victory for the team.



The team then moved to outside courts to play The Chase School, who had won their previous round. Will Craft (Year 8) played superbly in his Singles game against an opponent one year older, with Ed and Will's Doubles match was nail-bitingly close. However, they were victorious as the boys held their nerve and made it to the final, something that they hadn't considered would be possible.

All five boys played in the final, but the most memorable moment was Connor Young's endless rallies against his opponent, some of which were over 30 strokes long. Overall, the day was superb and left everyone inspired to want to return next year.
